## Three-Run Seventh Inning Pushes Long Boarders Past Hooks

**SAN MARCOS** – The Long Boarders defeated the Hooks, 4-1 at the CSUSM Baseball Field to earn their eighth win of the season, thanks to a strong pitching performance by Michael King and a three-run seventh inning highlighted by Drake Pierson's RBI double.

King allowed one run on one hit, two walks in six innings pitched with seven strikeouts to win his second game of the season. "I feel really good [about my performance]," said King. "I was pitching [mostly] fastballs and I went away from the slider after the second inning because [the Hooks] couldn't hit the fastball."

Connor Kinney took the loss for the Hooks as he allowed four runs (one earned) on one walk and seven hits in seven innings pitched.

The Hooks got their lone run in the first behind an RBI double by Michael Campagna that scored Michael Fritchman.

Kinney held the Long Boarders scoreless through the first four innings, but a defensive error by the Hooks in fifth gave the Long Boarders a chance to tie the game. Trevor Smith hit a sacrifice fly that scored Evan Rocha to tie the game, 1-1.

Jeff Woolson relieved King in the sixth and pitched two scoreless inning and allowed only two hits and struck out one.

Despite falling behind early, the Long Boarders and their head coach Dillan Smith remained focus and battled back. "It doesn't matter if we go down one early, we stayed in it the whole game," said Coach Smith. "Guys on the bench were up and when their names were called, they came in and put up a three-spot in the seventh."

With a runner on first in the top of the seventh, Drake Pierson hit a go-ahead RBI double that score Trevor Johnson as the Long Boarders took a 2-1 lead. Later that inning, Zak Thomas hit a two-run single that score Pierson and Avisail Bermudez to extend the Long Boarders' lead to 4-1.

"[Thomas] is a silent killer, [he] stays on the barrel the whole time [and he's] just a great situational hitter," said Coach Smith.

Dylan Vaugh came in the ninth to close the game out and after recording the first out, he gave up back-to-back singles to Campagna and Nathan Campo. With two on, one out and the game-tying run at the plate, Vaugh got the next two outs on a fielder's choice and flyout to right to secure his fourth save and the Long Boarders' 4-1 victory.

The Long Boarders maintain their first-place spot after improving to 8-3 this season, while the Hooks are in second place with a 6-5 record. Both teams will begin a three-game series starting Fri, June 21 at the CSUSM Baseball Field. The Long Boarders will take on the Warriors at 10:05 A.M as the Hooks battle the Jets at 1:35 P.M.
